



What should we measure?



***Keeping families together** was conceptualized as crucial for both relational permanency and child well-being (Avoid placement, place with or near family, avoid TPR, reunify)







Central Repository Model






- Entries into out-of-home care (DCYF)

- Trust/healing



Recommended Next Steps for Measuring Child Well-Being and Relational Permanency

Assemble

Assemble a cross-agency workgroup that includes lived experts, practice experts, data experts

Consider

Consider different data sharing models and agreements to facilitate data sharing

Co-Design

Partner with lived experts to enhance or develop new indicators in priority areas

Expand

Expand potential partnerships to collect and analyze important data

Crowdsourcing Ideas

How can you get involved?

Is your organization collecting or interested in collecting data in these areas?

Do you have measures you could share? (exit interviews, surveys)

Are you aware of funders who may be interested in funding co-design work to measure these outcomes?

Would someone from your organization be interested in joining the cross-agency workgroup?







Levels of Data Use for the Public Benefit of Children, Youth, Families, and Communities




Next Steps
